Library Job Shadowing Initiative

Library Ireland Week (LIW) has become a platform for enabling library staff to engage in work related exchange programmes that have been very successful to date. This year, LIW is facilitating a variation on the exchange programmes with the *Library Job Shadowing Initiative*. This initiative will allow staff from a variety of different libraries to spend a day in another library setting, gaining insight and understanding into how their colleagues deliver services to their users on a day-to-day basis.

How it Works: This Initiative offers library staff the opportunity to gain insight into the work of colleagues in other library organisations, in similar or completely different areas to where they currently work. Library staff interested in participating in this Initiative fill out the Application Form and submit to their Line Manager and the LIW Taskforce LAILibraryIrelandWeek@gmail.com. Library Line Managers must sign off on the request for leave to participate in the Initiative before arrangements are made for shadowing and travel. The Line Manager at the host institution must also sign off on the arrangements.

Library Students: This Initiative is also open to current Library Students and recent graduates who would like to gain insights into different roles and opportunities in the library world. Students should complete the Application Form and email LAILibraryIrelandWeek@gmail.com

Library managers at the host library will ensure that the staff involved experience an array of interesting / beneficial tasks for the Shadowing Day. At the end of the process, participants are invited to write a short report on their experiences. All library grades are invited to apply to this Initiative.

Library Staff Champion Award

Library Ireland Week is as much about librarians and the library sector as it is about raising awareness about the diverse and impactful work that happens in libraries all over the country every day. To mark and acknowledge library staff for their contributions to the sector, Library Ireland Week 2018 will launch the first annual Library Staff Champion Award.

Library colleagues are invited to nominate their peers for the Award which will be announced during Library Ireland Week 2018. The presentation to the winner of the Library Champion Award will take place in their Library with the President of the Library Association of Ireland and representatives of the LIW Taskforce – arrangements will be shared with the winners beforehand. All nominees will be notified if they have been nominated and the list will be published on the LAI website (subject to consent from all parties).

The Library Champion Award Package comprises of:

- Voucher & Trophy,
- an electronic signature marking the Award,
- free membership of the Library Association of Ireland for 1 year after the award.

How it Works: To nominate a colleague you feel embodies the positive impact library staff all over the country bring to their workplaces every day, download the Library Staff Champion Nomination Form. To complete this you will need:

- Name, Job Title and Email of the person they are nominating

- Reason for Nomination (max 300 words)

In the interests of impartiality, nominees will not be told who nominated them. The judging panel will create a shortlist of nominees who will then be contacted and invited to submit additional supporting materials for the final selection.

- Biography (max 200 words)
- CV (max 3 pages)
- Statement of Contribution to Library Life (max 700 words)
